SUBJECT: Executive Officer Interview – Krystle Heaney AICP

Background:

At the October 5, 2023, meeting, it was proposed that Krystle Heaney, AICP, a Planwest Partners Senior Planner, would become the Shasta LAFCo Executive Officer as part of the Planwest Partners Inc. staffing services contract beginning January 1, 2024. George Williamson, AICP, current Executive Officer, would stay on as senior advisor with a reduced workload. The Commission would continue to have Planwest's staff support and professional services. The Commission approved this transition plan by a 7-0 vote.

On November 16, 2023, the Executive Committee interviewed Krystle Heaney for the Shasta LAFCo Executive Officer contract position. The Executive Committee made a favorable recommendation that Krystle Heaney be considered for Executive Officer and be interviewed for that position by the Commission on December 7, 2023.

Discussion:

Legal Counsel facilitated the Executive Committee interview and will facilitate the Commission interview. given the current Executive Officer serves as part of the Planwest Partners Inc. staffing services contract.

Krystle Heaney is a Senior Planner for Planwest and provides support services for numerous LAFCos throughout the state from her location in El Dorado County. She currently provides clerking services for Humboldt LAFCo and Trinity LAFCo which includes processing service extension and boundary change applications in addition to conducting regular MSRs for cities and special districts.

She has also assisted with MSRs for numerous other LAFCos including Sacramento, Sonoma, El Dorado, Marin, Contra Costa, Shasta, and San Diego. Ms. Heaney also provides environmental planning services for LAFCos and other Planwest clients. She is well versed in CEQA regulations and stays up to date on current practices. Her Statement of Qualifications/Resume is attached.

Recommendation:

It is recommended the Commission take the following actions:

- 1. Conduct an interview with Krystle Heaney;
- 2. Consider appointing Ms. Heaney as the Shasta LAFCo Executive Officer, subject to approval of an amended Staffing Services Agreement amendment reflecting this appointment, effective January 1, 2024; and
- 3. Consider approving and authorizing the Commission Chair to sign an amendment to the existing Planwest Staffing Services Agreement, which is on the Commission's agenda as Agenda Item 9.a.

Ms. Heaney is the current clerk for Trinity LAFCo and has worked on several MSRs for Trinity LAFCo including Post Mountain PUD, Weaverville CSD, Ruth Lake CSD, and Hayfork FPD. She regularly prepares staff reports, communicates with Commissioners regarding upcoming meetings, and trains new staff on LAFCo processes. She is also responsible for regularly updating the Trinity LAFCo website and is proficient with the WordPress webpage platform.

• Shasta LAFCo Municipal Service Reviews

Ms. Heaney has been responsible for collecting data and drafting agency profiles for community services districts, community service areas, and mosquito abatement districts in Shasta County. She has also recently reviewed MSRs for the City of Shasta Lake and the proposed Shasta FPD. Services reviewed include water, wastewater, flood control, fire/ emergency response, and mosquito abatement activities. These MSRs have included regular contact with agency and county staff to collect information and review draft documents.

El Dorado LAFCo Municipal Service Reviews

Ms. Heaney managed the preparation of the Small to Medium Water and Wastewater Purveyors MSR/SOI Update which included Georgetown Divide PUD, South Tahoe PUD, and Grizzley Flats CSD. The project was complicated by the Caldor Fire that occurred in 2021 and almost completely destroyed the Grizzley Flat area. The MSR was able to effectively discuss the effects of the fire on the CSD and the steps the District was taking towards recovery. Ms. Heaney is now managing the Cities and CSD MSR which includes the Cameron Park CSD, City of Placerville, and City of South Lake Tahoe. As part of this process Ms. Heaney also prepared an in depth memo regarding SOI changes which included analysis of El Dorado LAFCo policies, county and city policies, and CEQA requirements.

Beckwourth Peak Fire Protection District Formation

Planwest, with assistance from RSG, was retained to prepare a feasibility study and plan for services for the formation of a new regional fire protection district in eastern Plumas County. The project included regular stakeholder meetings, coordination with four existing fire services providers, development of material to support an application to LAFCo along with a special tax measure to provide funding for the new district. Ms. Heaney assisted with developing the feasibility study/ plan for services including document template creation, and drafting background information and formation process sections.

<u>Contra Costa LAFCo Municipal Service Reviews</u>

Contra Costa LAFCo retained Planwest to conduct the 2nd Round Cemetery Services MSR/SOI update in 2021 which included Alamo-Lafayette Cemetery District and Byron Brentwood Knightsen Union Cemetery District.
