Subject: Proposed City of Redding Wastewater Water Services Extension The Commission will consider a proposal submitted by City of Redding Resolution of Application 2021-053 for proposed wastewater service extension to two parcels (Shasta County APNs 056-040-040 & -041). The City is requesting wastewater services be extended to the parcels located on Hermosa Way, outside of the city boundary and adopted sphere of influence.

BACKGROUND

Based on information provided by the City of Redding and the Shasta County Environmental Health Division (SCEHD) the undersized leachfield that serves the subject parcels has been observed discharging to the ground surface, which does not meet state health and safety standards (Exhibit A – SCEHD letter to property owners). Both of the subject parcels, located in the County unincorporated area, have septic tanks that would remain in use. Parcels connected to this leachfield must find an alternate disposal option. There is a City wastewater connection available.

Both the force main serving the failing leachfield and the City wastewater line/closest manhole are located on a triangle shaped vacant parcel adjacent to the northeast of the subject parcels, designated as open space and not developable (see figure below)., Other parcels connected to the force main and leachfield are located in the Redding City Limits and City staff is working with those residents on a similar disposal option.

Proposed Wastewater Connection

The City has determined it has the ability to serve the two subject parcels and submitted an application to LAFCo (Exhibit B). The City wastewater line to the east of the subject parcels is 48 inches in diameter and was sized for the buildout of this portion of the City. The existing laterals from the residences on the subject parcels (7223 & 7231 Hermosa Way) would have their current connections to the force main severed and would be connected to the closest City manhole, as shown in the figure shown below. The portions of the laterals under the creek would not be affected.

A contractor will be hired to switch lateral connections from the force main to the City wastewater line. An encroachment permit is required for this work. The parcel owners will pay a \$5,450 connection fee and \$300 tap fee to the City. Once connected the parcels will pay monthly wastewater service charges to the City.

Reasons/Findings for Proposal

The reasons for the services extension as set forth in application to LAFCo are as follows:

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California Government Code Section 56133 enables LAFCo to authorize a city to provide new or extended services by contract or agreement outside its jurisdictional boundaries under specified circumstances. In addition, Shasta LAFCo may approve proposals to extend services outside agency boundaries in the following cases:

The service extension is proposed to remedy a clear health and safety concern

The current leach field is undersized and there is surface discharge, in violation of Shasta County Environmental Health regulations

The services in question will not facilitate development

This service extension does not have the effect of increasing development intensity or other "growth inducing" effects, and simply ensures a safe and secure wastewater collection for existing residents.

Sufficient service capacity exists

The proposed connection would not impact wastewater system capacity. Closest wastewater connection is northeast of parcels as shown in figure.

According to information included in the City of Redding application, there is sufficient wastewater collection and treatment plant capacity to extend services to the subject properties.

Annexation not practicable at this time

The subject property is located outside the City of Redding's boundary and Sphere of Influence (SOI). Per LAFCo policy, the extension of services outside an agency's sphere is limited to situations in response to a public health or safety threat to residents of the affected territory. Annexation must show there is sufficient capacity for all municipal services and the SOI must be expanded prior to annexation. The City of Redding Municipal Services Review (MSR) and SOI Update is scheduled by Shasta LAFCO for FY 2021-22 and SOI changes will be considered that may support possible future annexation.

The proposal is consistent with the policies adopted in and pursuant to the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000.

The service extension request is consistent with Government Code Section 56133 and Commission Policy. In addition, Shasta LAFCo provided sufficient notice to interested and subject agencies, with no comments received by the deadline.

CEQA Exemption Justification

In accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), it is determined that the project is exempt from CEQA and qualifies for a Class 1 exemption (Section 15301) from the preparation of environmental documents. This class exempts the operation, repair, and minor alteration of existing publicly-owned utility facilities used to provide public utility services when there is negligible or no expansion of an existing use. Only the existing residences will be served by the wastewater connection. Further, the Lead Agency has determined that use of the categorical exemption is not barred by one of the exceptions set forth in CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2. LAFCo independently reviewed the project and determines that the project qualifies for a Class 1 exemption from CEQA.

Conducting Authority Proceedings

Cortese Knox Herzberg (CKH) Act Section 56133, provides for service extensions outside city or district boundaries and recognizes there may be unique local conditions among individual service providers and unincorporated communities. LAFCO policies favor annexation, especially for lands proposed for development. This application did receive 100% landowner consent, and approval is conditioned on providing consent to annex in the future. Commission action is subject to a 30-day reconsideration period.

RECOMMENDATION

APPROVE SUBJECT TO CONDITIONS:

It is recommended the following condition of approval be applied with delegation to the Executive Officer to determine when the requested actions have been sufficiently satisfied before proceeding with a recordation.

- Completion of the 30-day reconsideration period provided under G.C. § 56895.
- Payment of any outstanding fees
- The property owners sign Consent to Annexation Forms

NOTICE OF THE FAILURE OF THE COMMON LEACH FIELD SERVING YOUR RESIDENCE IN THE WOODED ACRES NORTH AND SOUTH SUBDIVISIONS

The Shasta County Environmental Health Division (SCEHD) recently confirmed evidence of the failure of the common leach field located at 7669 Avianca Drive which serves 31 properties in the Wooded Acres North and South subdivisions. Sewage was observed discharging to the ground surface during inspections conducted by SCEHD and Central Valley Regional Water Board (CVRWQCB) staff. Your residence is known to be connected to this failing common leach field via a septic tank and pump tank on your parcel that discharges to the force main. Therefore, your immediate attention and cooperation is required to remedy this health and safety concern.

The common leach field has been a long-standing concern, and a permanent solution can no longer be postponed. If a permanent resolution is not achieved, property owners could be found to be in violation of Section 5411 of the California Health and Safety Code (H&SC), which states, "[no] person shall discharge sewage or other waste, or the effluent of treated sewage or other waste, in any manner which will result in contamination, pollution or a nuisance". In addition, surfacing sewage also constitutes a violation of Shasta County Code Sections 8.41.050 (Discharges Prohibited) and 8.41.070 (Sewage Release Restrictions). Finally, lack of connection to an approved sewage disposal system could impact the habitability of your property pursuant to H&SC Section 17920.3.

There are options available to you. Since the construction of the City of Redding's (COR) Clover Creek interceptor sewer line along Meadow View Drive, several attempts by the COR, SCEHD, and CVRWQCB have been made to encourage all residents who are known to be discharging to the common leach field to connect to COR sewer before the leach field came to the end of its service life, which has been confirmed. Alternately, you can construct your own permitted Non-Standard onsite wastewater treatment system under direction of a qualified professional.

A virtual community meeting to discuss the sewer connection process is being planned by the City for March 30, 2021, at 6:00 pm. COR staff will send the announcement with a meeting link and call-in number to you under separate cover. State Water Resources Control Board staff will also be available to answer financing questions; it is possible that either a low-interest loan or a grant may be available to assist in financing the chosen resolution. COR Public Works staff, CVRWQCB staff, and SCEHD staff will participate in the meeting to help facilitate a permanent solution. COR staff is ready to help you meet the City's requirements and complete the process to connect to sewer service. Thank you for your consideration.

NOTICE OF VIOLATION FOR FAILING COMMUNITY LEACH FIELD SERVING THE WOODED ACRES NORTH SUBDIVISION, 7669 AVIANCA DRIVE, REDDING, ASSESSOR PARCEL NUMBER 056-590-028, V21-0052

The Shasta County Environmental Health Division (SCEHD) received a complaint report on February 2, 2021, that the community leach field serving residences in the Wooded Acres North subdivision is failing and sewage is surfacing onto the ground and flowing offsite. This leach field is located at 7669 Avianca Drive, in Redding which Assessor records confirm you are the current owner. The reporting party also stated that he and the current property owner observed this condition last Summer yet did not report it until Tuesday, February 2, 2021, during a phone conversation. Subsequently, SCEHD staff conducted an inspection with the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Board (CVRWQCB) staff and observed sewage on the ground surface in several locations directly adjacent to the end of the cul-de-sac on Avianca Drive.

Releasing sewage to the ground surface is a violation of the California Health and Safety Code (HSC) Article 2, Section 5411, which states, "No person shall discharge sewage or other waste, or the effluent of treated sewage or other waste in any manner which will result in contamination, pollution or a nuisance." Surfacing sewage also constitutes a violation of Shasta County Ordinance Code, including Sections 8.41.050 Discharges Prohibited, and 8.28.010, Maintaining a Public Nuisance.

Immediate action shall be taken to eliminate the surfacing sewage and to prevent any additional sewage from reaching the ground surface. Berms shall be constructed to prevent additional sewage from flowing offsite onto the public right-of-way and potentially into the storm drain located on Avianca Drive. Berm construction shall be completed by no later than February 8, 2021. Once completed, you will need to remove for proper disposal the debris on the adjacent sidewalk and gutter as this material may have been saturated with sewage. Provide a barrier at the drop-inlet to prevent discharges to the storm drain system.

Concurrently or following the construction of berms, work shall be completed to determine the cause of surfacing sewage and a detailed report of observation shall be submitted to the SCEHD and CVRWQCB for review. This report, documenting all observations and findings, and an
