7. SCHEDULED PUBLIC HEARINGS

a. City of Redding Draft Municipal Service Review/Sphere of Influence Update - California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Review.

Mr. Williamson gave information regarding a recent Court decision changed how CEQA decisions are agendized and was recently determined that the Brown Act requires that CEQA decisions must be listed as on the meeting agenda at least 72 hours prior to the meeting. He recommended to include the exemption finding in Resolution 2022-17 City of Redding MSR/SOI Update.

Chair Fust opened the public hearing. Beverly Fickes asked what the findings were and Mr. Williamson said he would respond under Agenda Item 7.b. Chair Fust closed the public hearing.

b. City of Redding Draft Municipal Service Review/Sphere of Influence Update.

Mr. Williamson discussed the staff report referring to the staff's proposal to include the Wooded Acres Subdivision in the Sphere of Influence Update (SOI). He stated it was a unique circumstance with municipal services. There are multiple jurisdictions, City of Redding, City of Anderson and Shasta County. The City of Redding is not in agreement with this portion of the SOI update.

The Commission questioned if the City Council had the final decision regarding Wooded Acres, and Mr. Williamson said LAFCO has the authority to set the SOI boundary as a Commission action. Commissioner Russell provided insight on the SOI updates. Commissioner Neutze objected to the boundary by highway 273.

Chair Fust opened the public hearing. Tiffany Lightle, City of Redding associate planner, objects to the SOI as stated because it would put an undue cost on the homeowners in that area to update the infrastructure. The wells are failing and the infrastructure is not adequate enough to serve the homeowners. Mr. Williamson responded saying if there was an annexation, there would be an obligation to the City, but the proposed update to the SOI would show issues for potential services that need to be planned for.

Commissioner Jones asked if the City of Redding did not want this area to be included in the SOI what would be the response from the City of Anderson. Peter Wickenheiser, City of Anderson Deputy Public Works Director stated the City of Anderson had no desire to include Wooded Acres in their SOI because they would not be able to tie the water system back into their pressure zone. He also

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reminded the Commission that back in the 1980's the City of Redding annexed the area Wooded Acres North. He also explained the water service via City of Redding and two wells located in the area along with jurisdictions which included lack of access to a property easement.

Sean O'Hare CAL Fire Unit Chief provided information on the various contracts with different fire agencies that service the area and wanted to know who would pay for the water cost. Chair Fust said there are no changes for services at this time, only the boundary area. Chair Fust closed the public hearing.

There was Commission discussion regarding corrections to be made in the report.

Motion to approve City of Redding MSR/SOI by Resolution 2022-17 with the exception of area down south on highway 273 (via map) was presented by Commissioner Neutze, seconded by Commissioner Russell, and passed by the following votes:
