A RESOLUTION OF APPLICATION BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE COTTONWOOD CEMETERY DISTRICT REQUESTING THE LOCAL AGENCY FORMATION COMMISSION INITIATE PROCEEDINGS FOR A CONSOLIDATION OF THE ANDERSON CEMETERY DISTRICT AND THE COTTONWOOD CEMETERY DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the Cottonwood Cemetery District (herein referred toas "CCD") and the Anderson Cemetery District (herein referred to as "ACD") both provide cemetery services pursuant to Public Cemetery District Law, Health and Safety Code S9000-9093; and

WHEREAS, CCD and the ACD have studied options for providing more efficient and costeffective services to the community and conclude that consolidation of the two entities is both feasible and appropriate at this time; and

WHERAS, the CCD is willing to succeed to all the rights, duties and obligation of the two consolidating Districts, thereby accepting the transfer of all responsibility for the cemetery services by CCD, together all assets current held by ACD to provide those services; and

WHEREAS, Government Code sec 56853 established that if all districts proposing a consolidation adopt substantial similar resolutions of application, the Local Agency Formation Commission ("LAFCo")

Shall approve the proposal but may impose mitigating terms and conditions; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the CCD, Support the proposed application to Shasta LAFCo to consolidate CCD with the ACD.

WHEREAS, public notice of the proposed consolidation was provided through a legal notice published in the Redding Record Searchlight on February 12, 2020.

NOW THEREFORE the Board of Trustees proposes the following:

- The Board hereby requests that Shasta LAFCo initiate proceedings to consolidate CCD and the ACD pursuant to Government Code Section56650 et seq., thereby designating the CCD to take responsibility for services now provided by the ACD ,together with all assets currently held by ACD to provide those services and provide for allocation and payment of existing, contingent and future liabilities.
- 2. The CCD is serving as Lead Agency for this proposal pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA0. LAFCo is a Responsible Agency. The CCD finds that the proposal is categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15320, which exempts special district consolidations where changes in organization of local governmental agencies do not change the geographical area in which the previously existing powers are exercised.

- 3. Pursuant to Government Code Section567009 (a)(4) the Districts propose that LAFCo apply the follow terms and conditions:
 - a. Request that July 1, 2020 be set the consolidation's effective date.
 - b. The apportionment of property tax revenues shall be the same as currently exists for the two consolidated Districts, unless and until the County and the District agree to change the apportionment.
 - c. The Board of Trustees of the consolidated CCD shall maintain its existing governance structure, consisting of five members appointed by the Board of Supervisors, per Public Cemetery District law. Residents within the former boundaries of the ACD shall enjoy full rights, and serve as members of the Board of Trustees of the post-consolidation District.
 - 4. The District staff is authorized and directed to take all actions consistent with this resolution to apply for and process the consolidation request with Shasta LAFCo
